Restore

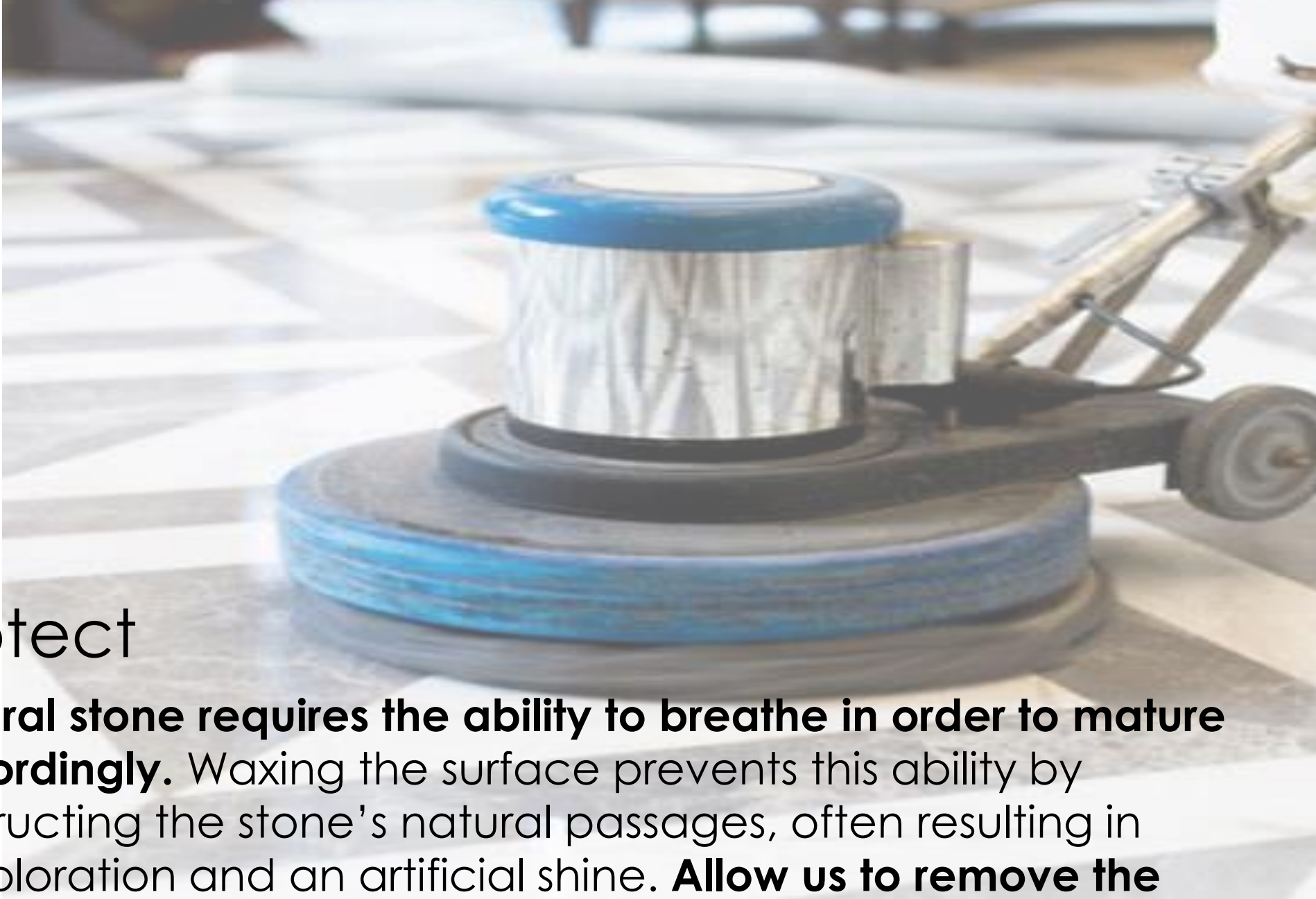
REFINE

Sealer Protection

- Prolong the life of your marble, granite or limestone surfaces with our **stone cleaning and sealing protection service**. In order to maintain your marble's quality finish, stone surfaces should be sealed every three to five years or depend upon foot-fall.



Protect

- **Natural stone requires the ability to breathe in order to mature accordingly.** Waxing the surface prevents this ability by obstructing the stone's natural passages, often resulting in discoloration and an artificial shine. **Allow us to remove the discolored wax and restore the natural look of your stone.**

Basic Marble polish Vs Complete Marble Restoration

- **BASIC MARBLE POLISH:**

Removes stains and fine scratches off the surface of the stone. This process includes a floor machine, which will have a polishing pad, with a polishing compound Liquid/cream. This allows the compound to agitate and exfoliate the stone, giving it a notable shine. Basic marble polishing is typically used as a maintenance procedure.

VS

- **COMPLETE MARBLE RESTORATION:**

This process is used on damaged marble, to bring the stone back to a “like new” finish. Marble restoration is typically a 3-step process as follows; Grinding, Honing or Polishing, Sealing/Buffering.

1) **Grinding** is the most dynamic step, as a floor machine with tough pads will be used for any lippage removal or flattening. This process is used for deeply embedded scratch and/or stain removal.

2) **THIS IS WHERE YOU DECIDE YOUR DESIRED APPEARANCE OF THE STONES FINISH**

Honing uses industrial diamond floor pads, to provide a desired smoothness to the stone. This process can also remove some scratches and stains, to have a more uniform appearance. This will produce a matte-like finish.

Polishing also uses diamond floor pads, slightly smaller grade than honing. As described above, polishing gives a semi-shine or shining effect to any marble.

3) **Sealing/Buffering:** is a method of marble “finishing”. This process uses a sealant that impregnates the marbles surface, and is buffed into the stone. This exercise creates a protective layer on the surface, making the marble more durable, while preserving the color and brightness of the stone. This is a good method of regular stone maintenance.

4) **Crystallization:** Crystallization is a method of marble floor finishing. Its brings “mirror like” shine by chemical reaction on the surface of marble. Crystallization also creates micro film on the surface of marble, which is more solid and durable and helps to preserve the color and the brightness of the marble. Crystallization is a very good method for regular stone maintenance

NATURAL STONE: DO'S AND DON'TS GUIDE

- **SO YOU WANT SOME TIPS ON HOW TO KEEP YOUR STONE LOOKING JUST AS BEAUTIFUL AS WHEN IT WAS FIRST INSTALLED?**

Natural stones may have a delicate chemical composition that could potentially interact in “strange” and damaging ways with any cleaning solutions that were not specifically formulated for the task. Once you know what to use, you just have to follow some basic guidelines to keep your natural stone in great condition long term. This guide will give you some simple do's and don'ts when it comes to routine maintenance of your stone.



- **ROUTINE PREVENTIVE MEASURES**

- **Do's** – use coasters underneath drinking glasses – especially those containing alcohol or citric juices – in order to avoid etching
- **Do's** – use place mats under objects that could scratch the surface, such as china and silver, etc.
- **Don'ts** – place any hot items directly on the stone surface. Be sure to use trivets or mats under hot dishes.

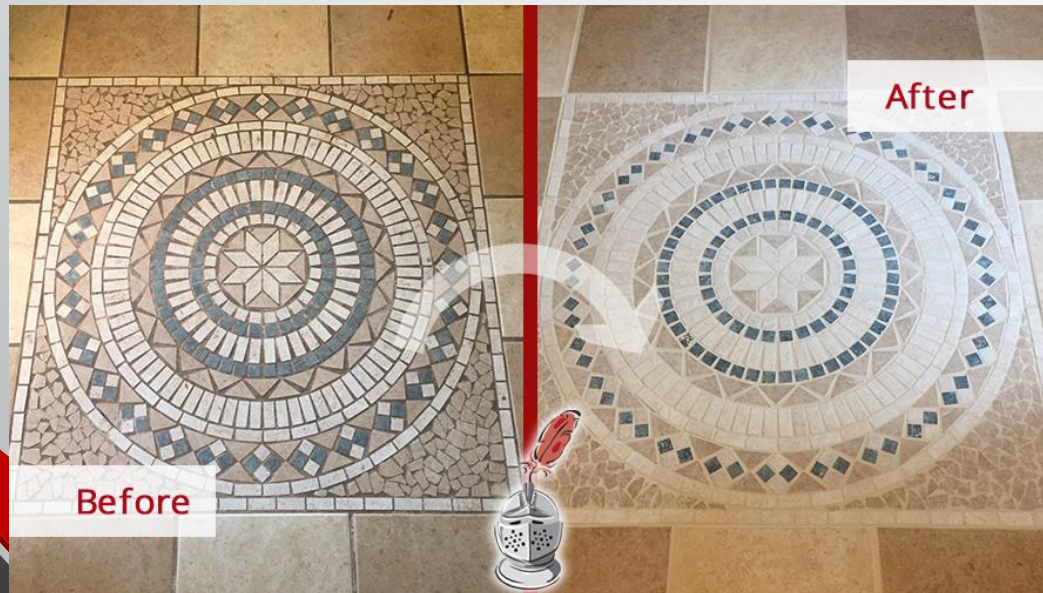
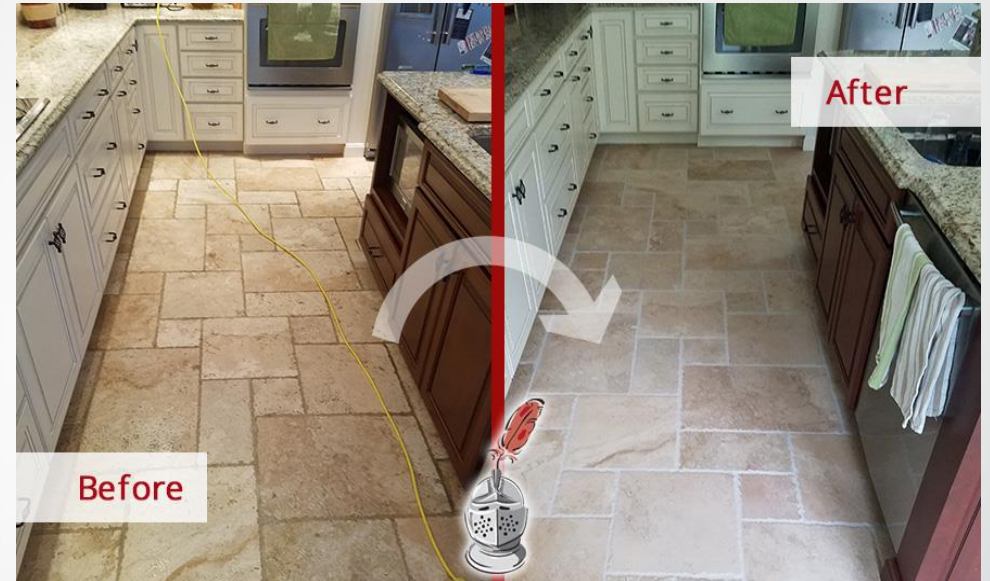
- **TREATING SPILLS**

- **Do's** – pick up any spills as quickly and efficiently as possible
- **Don'ts** – rub the spill; only blot it
- **Don'ts** – use cleaning products on or near natural stone unless the label specifies that it is safe for natural stone. This includes using things such as glass cleaners to clean mirrors over a marble vanity top for example, or liquid toilet bowl cleaner where the toilet is on a marble floor.

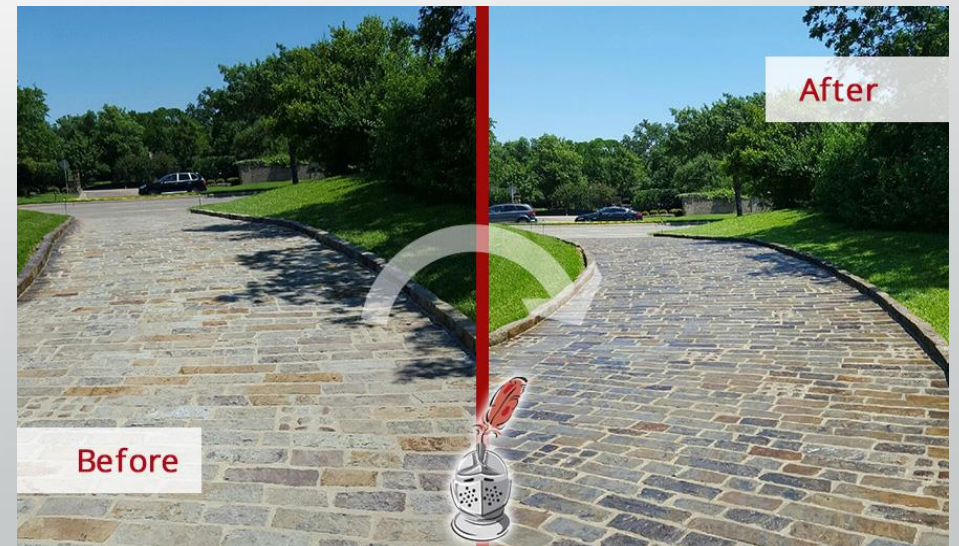
- **KITCHEN COUNTER TOPS**

- **Do's** – clean your kitchen countertop regularly and thoroughly with an appropriate stone safe cleaner ([pH-7 Neutral](#)). A higher concentration should be used near cooking and eating areas, and diluted water for areas with less traffic as in areas far from cooking and eating areas.
- **Do's** – use a conditioning stone polish occasionally in order to brighten up your polished stone surface.
- **Don'ts** – let any spills sit too long on the stone surface, If you do have dried-on spills...
- **Don'ts** – use any green or brown scouring pads for dried spills, as it will scratch the stone. It is safe to use the sponges lined with a silvery net, or other plastic scouring pads. Note: spray the cleaner and let it sit for a while before scrubbing it!
